The Seattle basin is floored by and postdates the Crescent basalts (Johnson et al., 1994). By analogy the other structural blocks may have once been continuous, with the exception of the northern and southern parts of the Crescent Formation, which appear to be separated by the Blue Mountain paleochannel (Tabor and Cady, 1978; Babcock et al., 1994).
